Your Community Updates

Your community is continually being maintained and enhanced to make it an even better place to live and visit. Here's a quick look at the last quarter's highlights.



Green Streets Ahead

The main driveway into your community has received a dose of greenery and a burst of colour with new landscaping additions over the past months. The centre median and right-of-way road sections were planted with bougainvillea pink pixies, ruellia flowers, jatrophas, Washingtonia palms and the very pretty and sprawling sesuvium varieties.

Offering visual consistency all the way until the DMCC exit and entry area, the splash of greenery continues encompassing the community in all its glory.

Walkways Through Green Views

A new pathway has been paved around the recently landscaped areas surrounding Clusters 19 and 26. The walkway follows a serpentine stretch that provides a calming effect for walkers and joggers treading the route.

Don't forget to pin this route for your next walking trail as you take in the stunning greenery on the side and explore your community on foot.



Bollard Boundaries

As part of our efforts to provide a visual boundary in and around Clusters 9 and 11, 37 and 39, and near Gate 3 of Jumeirah Islands, new U-shaped bollards have been installed.

These high-visibility horseshoe bollards indicate the edge of the roadways and serve as safety barriers for vehicles.



Lake Safety Instructions

40 safety signs were installed around community lake areas to notify residents and visitors of lakeside guidelines.

These instructions help safeguard passers-by and are bilingual with icons that make it easy to understand.





A Smoother Ride

With the excellent connectivity that roads in Jumeirah Islands offer, they are also heavily used by motorists. As a result, certain sections have suffered wear and tear over time. These areas were replaced with new asphalt across 1,600 square metres.

Remember to follow your internal community speed limits for a safe experience for fellow commuters and pedestrians using the roads.

New Collection Point for Garden Waste

As part of our efforts to centralise the collection of garden waste from all homes, we have introduced a dedicated drop-off location next to the Jumeirah Islands Security Control Room. To facilitate this arrangement, existing green waste skips will be removed from the cluster roundabouts from 01 May 2023.

Residents are advised to inform their gardeners or appointed landscaping personnel to dispose of all green waste at this new location with their own suitable transportation. By removing green waste skips from cluster roundabouts and other locations, we are also moving towards better sustainable operations and enhanced community aesthetics.




Eliminating Mosquito Breeding Sites

As the National Mosquito Control Programme entered its second phase with pest control treatments in public areas, we have been actively undertaking thermal fogging activities and scheduled safe treatments across vulnerable community common areas.

Although the mosquito menace is prevalent in cooler months, our teams repeat the activities round-the-year as a preventive measure to minimize the overall impact.

What you can do to keep mozzies at bay:

- Ensure there is no standing water in your flowerpots or garden.
- Install fly screens on open windows and doors.
- Use essential oils such as lavender and vanilla as a natural repellent for your home, and citronella while out in the garden.



Lights, Fruit Trees, and a View

Jumeirah Islands' fruit garden was developed with the objective of creating a place where residents can learn how to identify and conserve fruit trees. Beyond the delicious fruits and fragrances that these trees fill the garden with, we have taken the visual aesthetics a notch above with our new festoon lights around the gazebo.

At dusk, these brighten up the garden space and add a dash of festive feel to the community. We are adding more lights to other gazebos in the community.







Illuminated Perfection

A night drive around the community reveals the beauty and splendour that sundown brings with it to Jumeirah Islands. Here are the lighting enhancements we had undertaken these past months.

LED-lit Streets

For enhanced visibility and to highlight the internal streets, 57 streetlights were replaced with new ones, while 167 light poles were given a comprehensive round of maintenance.

Adorned Palms

180 palm trees lining the entrance driveways were wrapped with long-lasting and weatherproof LED string lights, presenting the fronds and grand trunks in all their glory. The spiral design creates a stately effect on your prime neighbourhood.

Lights, Water, Action

We added life and drama to four water fountains by illuminating them with new LED lights.

So, the next time you venture out, don't miss the highlights created by the movement of the fountain water.

Recycling Used Home Cooking Oil

In our efforts to safeguard the environment and our communities, we have joined hands with our waste management partner Averda, to sustainably convert used cooking oil from households into a greener form of fuel - biofuel.

Join our Campaign

As part of the free initiative, we distributed a green collection container with a funnel and filter to all homes, bearing a QR code on how to use the container. Once the containers are full, residents can visit their cluster roundabout to locate the large blue collection barrels and empty the contents.

How Does Your Community Benefit?

For each litre of cooking oil collected and deposited by the residents, the community is rewarded with an amount that is collected and re-invested into a sustainable project or initiative for the welfare of the community.

TLC for your Home



Time for a Home Health Check

Your home needs constant upkeep and maintenance to keep it in its prime and pristine condition just like your community. Add these items to your home maintenance checklist for a stress-free summer.

- ▶ Appoint a certified technician to check your smoke detectors and fire alarm installations.
- ► Schedule pest control to ward off any pests and bugs.
- ▶ Treat prolonged water leaks by fixing clogged drains or damaged water fittings.
- ► Service your HVAC unit for a smooth summer run.
- Sign up for an annual contract with a reputed general maintenance company to keep a tab on your mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems.

Stay covered with the right insurance

It's never too late to invest in insurance that covers your prized home and possessions and gives you the peace of mind you deserve. Contents Insurance does just that in the event of the unexpected – be it a theft, fire, or water leakage.

Community insurance only covers the common areas such as roads, amenities, signage, streetlights, walls, and irrigation systems. Contents insurance is the sole responsibility of a resident.

Five Steps Towards Good Air Quality

As temperatures rise, it's time to turn the air-con back on again. Here's a quick checklist for you to prepare your home's air-conditioning system ahead of use.

- ▶ Clean the air filters. Remember, poor indoor air quality can affect your health.
- ▶ If you have an outdoor unit, check for debris or dust accumulation.
- Test the system to ensure that there is no noise or odour generated.
- Ensure that electrical plugs and sockets are of standard quality, to avoid short-circuits
 or fire accidents.
- ▶ Open the windows and doors of your home, when weather and outdoor air quality permit.

Storing Household Chemicals

Chemicals are a common sight in most households, from cleaning agents, paints, and thinners to pesticides. But these can pose a health and fire hazard, if not handled with care.

- Understand the warning symbols they indicate that the product could be hazardous.
- Follow the safety information and directions, when using the materials.
- Open a nearby window to ensure adequate ventilation, when using the chemicals.
- ▶ Choose low-emission paints, varnishes, and glues, wherever possible.
- ► Store chemical products in their original containers.
- ▶ Store flammable materials in fire-rated containers and away from combustible materials.
- Lock and keep these chemicals out of children's reach.
- ▶ Dispose of household hazardous waste products safely.

With the recent issuance of community usage charges to homeowners, on-time payment of these charges is important. These rates are vetted by independent auditors and approved by the Real Estate Regulatory Authority. A delay in settling your usage charges on time has an effect on the operations of your community, as funds are required to pay service providers, utility bills, and community enhancements.

Responsible Landscaping Starts at Home

With the beauty that a garden offers comes the responsibility of keeping it properly maintained and landscaped. Here are our top three tips for a clean and green surrounding for your home.

- ➤ Your garden is your responsibility. Plant large trees away from villa walls, as far-reaching roots can damage boundary walls and villa foundations.
- ▶ No neighbour likes a stray creeper encroaching into their space. Trim your plants and trees regularly to avoid them from invading common areas and neighbouring properties.
- ▶ Do not hang weights over the boundary walls or common areas to secure your landscaping, as these pose a safety hazard.

Residents' Recipe Corner

There's nothing like a tropical summer salad to beat the summer heat of 2023. Our resident, Deborah Schipper whipped up a delicious summer bowl and sent us the recipe.

It's called the Palm Hearts Tabbouleh.

Ingredients

- ▶ 1/2 cup bulgur
- 1 cup diced cucumber
- ▶ 1 cup diced tomato
- ► 410g can of palm hearts (drained and sliced)
- ▶ 1 teaspoon sea salt
- ▶ 1 large bunch of flat-leaf parsley

- ▶ 1/3 cup chopped fresh mint
- ► 1/3 cup thinly sliced green onion
- ▶ 1/3 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- ▶ 3 tablespoons lemon juice
- ▶ 1 medium clove garlic, minced

Preparation

- Prepare bulgur according to package instructions.
- Combine the diced cucumber and tomato in a medium bowl with salt and let the mixture rest for at least 10 minutes.
- ► To prepare the parsley, cut off the thick stems and finely chop and add to a large bowl. Add the cooled bulgur, chopped fresh mint, and green onion to the bowl of parsley. Strain off and discard the cucumber and tomato juice that has accumulated in the bottom of the bowl (this ensures that your tabbouleh isn't too watery).
- Add the strained cucumber and tomato to the bowl. Add sliced palm hearts.
- In a small measuring cup or bowl, whisk together the olive oil, lemon juice, garlic, and salt. Pour it into the salad and stir to combine.

 Taste, and adjust if necessary—add another tablespoon of lemon juice for zing, or salt for more overall flavour.

This serves six people.

Author's special note: Add the delicate flavour of hearts of palm to tabbouleh. These vegetables look like white asparagus and taste similar to artichokes. Palms hearts are harvested from the core of some species of palm trees and are perfect for summer salads.


